Making a Difference: 5th Annual Palmetto Golf Outing To Honor Ryan “Bomb G” Baumgardner by Raising Funds for Local Youth Sports and Education.

PALMETTO, FL – September 29, 2010 - Palmetto’s Nancy and Bill Baumgardner’s son Ryan was always his own person. As sports editor and staff writer for University of Nevada Las Vegas’ “The Rebel Yell” student publication, Ryan “could extract extreme emotions and was never one to be ignored,” said his father Bill.

After graduating from UNLV, Ryan remained in Las Vegas as a contributing writer for several local sports publications. Ryan passed away in 2005 at age 25, and to honor his memory in his unique style, his parents created the “Bomb G Memorial Trust” with a mission of supporting and providing assistance for financially dependent students and youth sports organizations.

Since they received the news of Ryan’s death while on the 13th hole at Palmetto’s Imperial Lakewoods Golf Course, the Baumgardner’s did not want to forever have negative memories of the course. They turned the situation around by creating an annual golf tournament to celebrate Ryan’s life and to support the Bomb G Memorial Trust; this year’s 5th Annual Ryan “Bomb G” Baumgardner Memorial Golf Outing will be held on Saturday, November 6, 2010 at Imperial Lakewoods Golf Course.

The Golf Outing’s goal is to raise money for both a UNLV scholarship endowment in Ryan’s name, along with benefiting other non-profit organizations whose missions align with that of the Bomb G Memorial Trust - that is, non-profits that focus on youth education, youth sports and diversity. Recipients of the tournament proceeds include Adaptive Golf Foundation of Sarasota, Pop Warner Football, The Gap School of Sarasota and the Sarasota Bar Association’s Diversity Scholarship.

“Ryan was a unique person. He loved journalism and sports, particularly wrestling. He was outspoken, independent and had a fierce personality. If Ryan’s legacy makes a true difference in the life of even one person, we will have succeeded in honoring him. That is our goal,” says his father Bill.

The 5th Annual Ryan “Bomb G” Baumgardner Memorial Golf Outing Event, also benefiting the Adaptive Golf Foundation, will be held at Imperial Lakewoods Golf Course in Palmetto on Saturday, November 6, 2010. Registration is at 11 a.m., followed by shotgun start at 1 p.m. The evening includes dinner and silent auction at 6 p.m. Register online at Bombg.com. The cost is \$85 per Golfer or \$320 per foursome. Registration is due by October 29, 2010.
